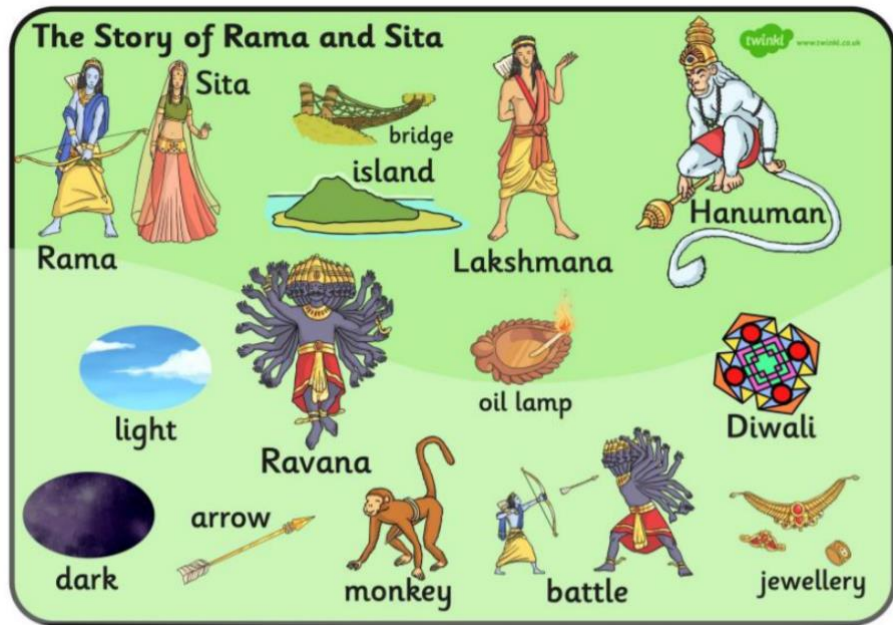

**Hinduism**

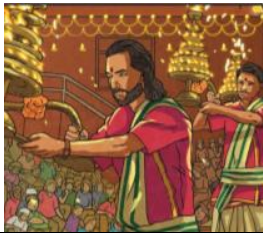

**Diwali**



Diwali is the 'festival of lights' and is celebrated in late autumn. Diwali celebrates the victory of good over evil and light over darkness. At Diwali, some Hindus remember the story of Rama and Sita returning from exile, where their way home was lit by lamps. Hindus light diya lamps at Diwali to welcome Lakshmi into their homes. Fireworks, presents and new clothes are used to celebrate.

Diwali always falls some time between October and November, but the exact date varies each year as the Hindu calendar is based on the Moon. In 2021, Diwali is on Thursday 4 November.
