BEHAVIOUR PRINCIPLES WRITTEN STATEMENT

Our philosophy at Ashleigh is that “Teachers have a right to teach and children have a right to learn in a classroom that is free from disruptive behaviour.”

We believe that good behaviour is essential to allow all our pupils to achieve their full potential. Good behaviour promotes effective learning; effective teaching and learning promote good behaviour.

We build on the positive patterns of behaviour the pupils have already learnt, and we talk to the children about what it is to be an Ashleigh child.

An Ashleigh child

- Shows respect and gains respect from others;
- Is kind and caring to others;
- Considers and celebrates difference;
- Takes care of other people’s property;
- Listens to others;
- Tries their best;
- Is proud to belong to the school community.

We use a system of rewards for good or improving behaviour, and sanctions where standards fall below an expected level. These rewards and sanctions are applied consistently and fairly across the school.
