The Big Idea

What is Geography?

Where do I belong?

Where do I live?

Content

- Children will learn what Geography means and why we learn about it
- Children will learn that they belong to a community e.g. school – similarities and differences
- Children will learn about maps and how to draw information from them – similarities and differences about their walk to school
- Children will learn how to describe what they can see, hear and feel whilst outside
- Children will learn that what they see, feel and hear is about their environment

This will include a local area walk.

Early Learning Goal Links (*Progression of Skills Document will have more in-depth 'I can' statements'*)

Past and Present: Talk about the lives of the people around them. Know some similarities and differences between things in the past and now, drawing on their experiences.

People, Cultures and Communities: Describe their immediate environment using knowledge from observation, discussion, stories, non-fiction texts and maps.

The Natural World: Know some similarities and differences between the natural world around them

Speaking: Express their ideas and feelings about their experiences using full sentences, including use of past, present and future tenses and making use of conjunctions, with modelling and support from their teacher.

The learning in this unit will prepare the children to learn these things in the future:

Year 1 Geography - Where is Ashleigh Primary School?

Year 1 History – Past and Present – they know about similarities and differences between themselves and others.

Year 1 PSHE – What is the same and different about us?

WHAT PUPILS NEED TO KNOW OR DO TO BE SECURE

Show understanding of the **concept** using key vocabulary correctly

By the end of this unit, the children at the expected standard will:

- Know that Geography is learning about people and places
- Talk about their school
- Talk about their journey to school
- Use a simple map to describe their journey to school
- Identify simple features of their immediate environment

Some children will be able to identify that we live in the United Kingdom and will be able to identify this on a world map.
