

Project: Fireworks and Festivals

The Big Idea

Why do people celebrate different things? Why do people celebrate different events in different ways? What is special to different people?

Content

- Children will learn how festivals are celebrated.
- Children will learn how Hindus celebrate Diwali.
- Children will learn why Remembrance Day is important.
- Children will learn how celebrations are used to help people to remember things that are important
- Children will learn how fireworks are used to celebrate different festivals.
- Children will learn how people enjoy celebrating together as a community.
