- Which characters from traditional tales do you know?
- Who is your favourite character from a traditional tale?
- Why do you like that character?
- Can you describe a character from a traditional tale for me to guess?

Story, character, setting, sequence, a long time ago, once upon a time, happily ever after, main event, beginning, middle, end, cottage, forest.
Feelings: happy, sad, excited, frightened, scared, brave, calm.

We will be learning all about traditional tales this term. We will be thinking about the different characters, the similarities and differences between the stories we read and the settings the stories take place in. We will also be learning about the structure of a story; the beginning, the middle and the end. We will use this learning to help us develop our understanding of vocabulary and story language and also use this in our role play. This will help us learn how to narrate, retell, invent, adapt and recount narratives.

We will learn lots about materials during this project and talk about their purposes and properties.

In Maths, we will be learning more about bonds to 10, including doubling facts and subtraction facts.

We will continue with our Music, PE and PATHS learning as well as further developing our understanding of our Guiding Stars; confidence, empathy, teamwork, safety, responsibility, perseverance.
