Three ways to use templates and pattern pieces

Thin Card



Use clear sticky tape to position pattern on fabric. Cut around the pattern.

Thin Card



Use soft chalk pastel or soft white crayon to draw around the pattern prior to cutting out.

Paper



Use pins to secure the pattern on the fabric. Cut around pattern.

Different joining techniques



Vocabulary	
glove puppet	a glove puppet fits over the hand, and the fingers operate its head and arms
fabric	cloth that is woven or knitted
needle	a thin, sharp, metal tool used for sewing
thread	fine cord used for sewing
pin	a small, stiff wire with a sharp point used for joining
sew	to join pieces of fabric with stitches
stitch	one movement of a needle and thread through cloth or other material when sewing
glue	a thick, sticky liquid used to join things together
template	a shape drawn to assist in cutting out shapes
pattern piece	a paper template used in sewing
mark out	to draw lines round a template so the shape can be seen
join	to put, bring, or fasten together
decorate	to make more beautiful by adding designs
features	a part or quality of something
suitable	right for the situation or purpose
quality	a feature that makes a person or thing what it is
mock-up	a model which allows one to try out ideas using cheaper materials and temporary joints.
design	to generate, develop and communicate ideas for a product
evaluate	to judge how a product meets chosen criteria
user	the intended person in mind when designing a product
purpose	a reason or plan that guides an action, design or goal
