



<p>English The children will be reading the book 'Jemmy Button' by Jennifer Uman and Valerio Vidali.</p> <p>Throughout this half term the children will be focusing on how to write a newspaper report. They will be adapting their tone to the style of newspaper report writing. They will be learning to use inverted commas for dialogue when reporting witness statements, writing in past tense and using time adverbials for chronological order.</p>	<p>Maths During this half term the children will be recapping and using money including calculating change and amounts. We will then move on to time, where they will be learning to tell the time, calculate duration and apply to word problems.</p> <p>The children will be further cementing their knowledge of place value and the relationships between numbers as well as learning how to compare, order and sequence numbers and values. In this unit pupils will improve on key skills used in dodgeball such as throwing, dodging and catching. They learn how to apply simple tactics to outwit their opponents. In dodgeball, pupils achieve this by hitting opponents with a ball whilst avoiding being hit. Pupils are given opportunities to play games independently and are taught the importance of being honest whilst playing to the rules.</p> <p>Rugby Tag rugby is an invasion game. In this unit pupils develop their understanding of the attacking and defending principles of invasion games. In all games activities, pupils have to think about how they use skills, strategies and tactics to outwit the opposition. In tag rugby pupils do this by maintaining possession and moving the ball towards the try line to score. Pupils develop their understanding of the importance of fair play and honesty while self-managing games and learning and abiding by key rules, as well as evaluating their own and others' performances.</p>
