Humans can use computers to communicate with each other and collaborative projects can be done together on different devices at the same time.

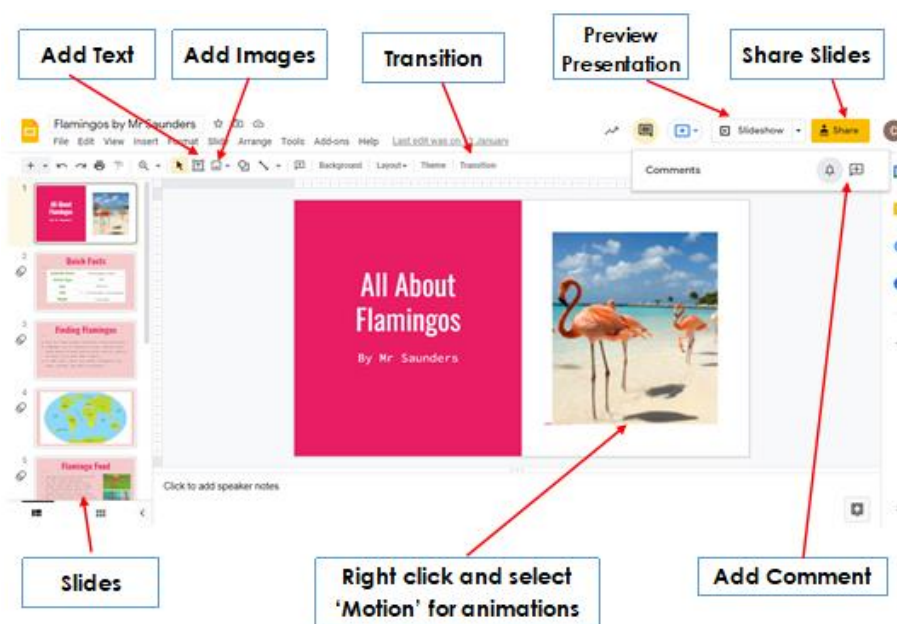
What should I already know?

| Communicate | To 'speak' to someone (or something) either in person or digitally. |
| Collaborate | To work with somebody else to complete a specific task, |
| Cloud | A digital storage system to save files. |
| Animation | How a digital image moves. |
| Transition | How you move from one digital image to another. |
| Presentation | How information is relayed to an audience. |
| Slide | A single part of a presentation created digitally. |
| Copyright | A legal term used to describe who owns something digital. |
| Text Box | A digital space used to insert text into a document. |
| Document | A piece of written, printed, or electronic matter that provides information. |
