


<p><u>English</u></p> <p>The children will be reading the book Malamander by Thomas Taylor. This adventurous coming-of-age story is a funny, engaging story about a young pairs search for a mysterious creature.</p> <p>They will use this book alongside other key texts to begin to produce an explanation text – a clear piece of non-fiction explaining how something works. The children will learn to write very formally so that readers trust what they are saying.</p>	<p><u>Maths</u></p> <p>During this half term the children will be learning about measurement, perimeter and area.</p> <p>The children will be learning to convert between various measurements, including time and length. They will then learn how to work out the perimeter and area of rectangles and rectilinear shapes.</p>	<p><u>Science</u></p> <p>How do bodies change as we get older? By the end of this unit, they will know:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • When babies are young, they grow rapidly. They are very dependent on their parents. As they develop, they learn many skills. • At puberty, a child’s body changes and develops primary and secondary sexual characteristics. This enables the adult to reproduce.
<p><u>Design Technology</u></p> <p>Can you make a dish with the flavours of a culture?</p> <p>By the end of this unit, they will know:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • How to use the bridge hold and claw grip when chopping ingredients and how to use peelers and graters safely. • About the principles of a healthy diet. • That some recipes have to be followed exactly and others can be adapted for taste. • That certain flavours are common from certain countries/regions around the world. 	<p style="text-align: center;">Year 5 Summer 1 - Learning Map</p> 	<p><u>PSHE</u></p> <p>Why are people rude and how do you deal with it? The children will be learning that in order for society to function, we need people to do different jobs. It is important that everyone is treated with the same level of respect.
