Historical summary

The story of the Trojan Horse is well-known. First mentioned in the Odyssey, (the Odyssey is an epic poem in 24 books traditionally attributed to the ancient Greek poet Homer) it describes how Greek soldiers were able to take the city of Troy after a fruitless ten-year siege. It is said that by hiding in a giant horse, supposedly left as an offering to the goddess Athena. With Greek soldiers hiding inside, they were bought into the city of Troy, when they had previously not been able to get past the wall. Once inside the walls the soldiers opened the gates and let the rest of the arm in.
