- The capital city of Greece is Athens
- Athens is thought to be one of the world's oldest cities
- Athens has many historical landmarks, the Acropolis and the Parthenon are probably the most well-known of these.
- Today Athens is a large modern city
- Greece has a varied physical geography; mountains, islands, beaches, volcanic islands.



- There are thousands of Greek islands in the Aegean and Ionian seas, only 170 are inhabited.
- The islands are popular with tourists.
- Greece is estimated to attract around 30 million tourists each vear.
- There are lots of benefits to a place from tourism, but there can also be negative effects from tourism.
