building	a large structure built for people to live in or do things in.
capital city	A capital is a city where a region's government is located. This is where government buildings are and where government leaders work
continent	any of the world's main continuous expanses of land
Europe	The second smallest of the world's seven continents.
human feature	Human features are those made by humans and which humans have changed or influenced
landmark	a usually large object on land that is easy to see and can help a person find the way to a place near it. It might be an important building or something natural.
physical feature	Physical features are determined as anything that is on the Earth naturally.
river	A river is the path that water takes as it flows downhill towards the ocean.
tourist	A tourist is a person who is visiting a place for pleasure and interest, especially when they are on holiday.
