### What makes Wymondham special?

#### Vocabulary

<b>County</b>	A geographical region of a country, for example Norfolk.
<b>Border</b>	The real or imagined line that separates geographical areas.
<b>Services</b>	Useful features in a geographical area, such as schools, doctors, transport.
<b>Landmark</b>	A recognizable natural or human feature that stands out.
<b>City</b>	A human settlement larger than a town. Normally densely populated.
<b>Town</b>	A human settlement, larger than a village but smaller than a city.
<b>Coastline</b>	The land along the coast.
<b>Broads</b>	A network of rivers and lakes.
<b>Aerial Photograph</b>	A photograph taken from the sky.
<b>Key</b>	A way of describing the features of a map.
<b>Digital Map</b>	A map available on a computer.

	<p>England has 27 counties.                  Norfolk is the fourth largest.                  Norfolk has a long coastline – touching the Wash in the north and the North Sea in the East.                  It also has lots of countryside, with many villages and towns.                  Norwich is the county's city.</p>
	<p>Wymondham is a market town, situated in South Norfolk.                  It has a population of roughly 17,000.                  It is about 10 miles from the nearest city – Norwich.</p>
	<p>It is well connected by road and rail services.</p> <p>It has many local landmarks – such as Wymondham Abbey and the Market Cross.</p> <p>It has services that provide the population of Wymondham with what they need for day-to-day life. Examples: food shops, train station, petrol stations, leisure centre, parks, schools and more.</p>
